BURLINGAME CLUB VALENTINE BAGS for ELDERHELP



The Burlingame Club has been putting together Valentine bags for many years. Pat Taylor got the Club started doing 25 bags and now it is 50 bags! A few years back, Pat turned the organization of this Club activity over to Valerie Lake. All year Valerie accepts travel soaps/shampoos and stores them in her home. She is always on the lookout for bargains--last summer she bought fine quality red and white dish towels, 12 for \$10, at Costco! Each bag contains several small shampoos, lotion and soaps, a puzzle book and colorful pencil, a dish/tea towel, chap stick, nail file, decorative tissue packet, etc. As seen in the photo, everything is put in a Valentine bag with a replicated old fashion Valentine card from the Burlingame Club.

Since ElderHelp assists a few elderly men, we started last year to make some bags with men's items. In addition, this year we made six bags for Club member Mary Tarbell-Green, Interfaith Minister/Hospice Chaplain for San Diego Hospice, to distribute to her patients. Mary sent the Club a lengthy letter telling how one patient and adult son caregiver felt receiving the Valentine bags.

The delivery of the bags to ElderHelp was greeted with delight by the staff, who started thinking of clients, among their 300, who would particularly appreciate the gift. "Burlingame" will be cherished in their memories.

HOUSE OF INTERNATIONAL FLAIR at 3139 KALMIA - THE HOME OF LOIS DRAPER

Members of the Burlingame Club, friends and family awaited Lois Draper's move back to her Burlingame home at 3139 Kalmia (one of the 1912 Benbough houses), in June of 2011. Though she had made most of the Club's meetings, driving from her home in Escondido, we looked forward to having her return to the neighborhood. What follows is the tale of Lois's comings and goings in Burlingame. I interviewed her a few months after her return--for good?

From the moment one enters Lois's home you know she has traveled the world. Ask Lois about the objects displayed and she will transport you to Kazakhstan, Saudi Arabia or Yemen. But first we need to get Lois into Burlingame.

In 1971 Lois was visiting her sister, Jenny, who lived nearby on 33rd Street, when she was told that work was going on on a large house on Kalmia. Lois, husband Bob, and 4 children had outgrown their Allied Gardens home. Lois contacted the owner of 3139 Kalmia, Mrs. Steickman, who agreed to show her the house. Mrs. Steickman and her husband, who owned and operated a hardware store on 30th and Juniper where Madeline's is now, had purchased the house during the war years and because housing in San Diego was in short supply, they turned it into a rooming house. They installed a new front door, (still visible to the left of the original front door) new stairs and rented out the individual rooms upstairs. Lois thinks the tenants cooked on hot plates in the closets!

The Steickmans had not maintained the house and it was in shambles, but Lois liked the 4 bedrooms and 2 baths on the second floor. She and Bob bought the house for \$32,000 with a simple hand shake to seal the deal and moved in with their 4 children: Michael, Michelle, Melinda and Scott. The children went to McKinley, Bob worked as a math consultant for the San Diego Unified School System and Lois dealt with various restoration challenges. Just one example was the removal of the third story bedroom which was beyond repair.

Then in 1975, Bob surprised Lois with a question: "How would you feel about moving to Saudi Arabia?" Though they had often talked about teaching overseas, Europe was what they had had in mind. This position would be in Jiddah where Bob would be the curriculum director for an international school system on a two year contract. Lois's response, as she remembers it, was that they could do anything for just 2 years. They decided to go, and rented their Kalmia home. As it turned out, the Drapers were gone for 8 years and their tenant stayed the entire time.

The Draper children left to go to high school in the US, while Bob and Lois continued their stay in Saudi Arabia. In 1989, they returned to San Diego to work as superintendent of the Christian Unified School System in El Cajon and in the Education Department at the San Diego Museum of Art respectively. But 1996 found them working overseas again, this time in Yemen. From there, they moved to Almaty, Kazakhstan in 1997. In 2002 Bob was diagnosed with a brain tumor and they returned to the United States for medical treatment. Bob had surgery but died 8 weeks later.

Lois returned to 3139 Kalmia. In a bereavement group, she met Andy, a widower whose wife had also died from cancer. They married and Lois moved to his home in Escondido. Lois liked her home there but she missed the familiar support of her Burlingame neighbors and friends. Sadly, Andy died in 2010 and Lois eventually decided she wanted to move back to Burlingame and 3139 Kalmia. So we all extend a welcome back, Lois!
